## **Communicating with Disabled Children**

**5 March 2008, 9.15-3.00 Venue: Festival Hall, Denton on 9 May 2008**

This is a one day course designed to explore the issues around communicating with disabled children, including children with learning difficulties and communication difficulties. It is designed to promote practice that complies with current legislative, regulatory and practice requirements.

These include Every Child Matters, Every Disabled Child Matters, UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, Disability Equality Duty, 1989 Children Act, 2004 Children Act. It is also designed to link to specific strands of workforce development. It is useful but not essential if applicants have attended the one day 'Communicating with Children' course. Course Facilitators: Anne Reid and Angela Holland

### **Aims of the course:**

- To increase awareness of the need to actively communicate and consult with disabled children.
- To explore methods of communication, and to consider/recognise/address the barriers and difficulties.
- To consider the views of disabled children, and how to promote inclusion and participation
- To recognise the importance of communication in keeping children safe.

### **Who would benefit from this course:**

- All staff and carers who are in direct contact with children in their work
- Foster carers, social workers, community support workers, residential workers, family support workers, staff from the wider workforce involved in working with children.

The timing of the training has been designed to make it accessible for carers and others who may have limited daytime availability

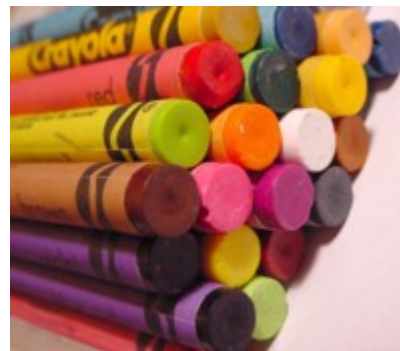

## New policies and reports



### **Tameside Children and Young People's Plan – New priorities for 2007-2008**

Tameside has a three year children and young people's plan that is reviewed every year in consultation with the community. As well as the five outcomes from Every Child Matters, the priorities for 2007- 2008 are to:

- Reduce the rates of teenage pregnancy
- Continue to strengthen support for children and young people's mental and emotional wellbeing through a comprehensive Children and Adolescent Mental Health Service
- Continue to raise attainment at all stages of learning with a strong focus on under-attaining groups and schools
- Improve attendance and inclusion outcomes in targeted schools
- Increase the proportion of young people moving into education, training and employment
- Improve children and young people's health outcomes, including a reduction in obesity and substance misuse, through the promotion of healthy lifestyles

In addition to the above priorities the partnership will:

- Continue to work hard to reduce the impact of domestic abuse on children, improve the stability of placements for looked after children and ensure that safeguarding issues are kept high on the agenda
- Develop integrated services for children with disabilities
- Develop a comprehensive and well publicised range of support for parents

## Scrutiny report - demonstrating the strategic value of the local and voluntary sector

The report from the Joint Scrutiny Panel to consider the strategic effectiveness of the Voluntary and Community Sector in Tameside has been produced. It can be found at <http://www.t3sc.myzen.co.uk/e-newsletterfeb08-policies.htm>

The report reviews the sectors contribution to Tameside and makes recommendations for the development of the sector. It looks at how important the role of the voluntary sector in enhancing public service delivery.

Cllr Allison Gwynne (Chair 2005/06) and Cllr Brenda Warrington (Chair 2006/07 and 2007/08) explain: 'The aim of the review was to provide a picture of the current and potential role of the sector in addressing local issues in partnership with the Local Strategic Partnership.

A detailed mapping exercise and over thirty interviews with voluntary and community groups and local agencies carried out for the review demonstrate the invaluable contribution the sector makes to tackling a variety of local priorities including health and social care, community safety, and training and employment as well as providing numerous recreational activities. There also appears to be great potential within the sector to expand its strategic role.

However, the sector faces a number of constraints not least its resource capacity, the processes involved in partnership working and involvement at strategic level. The Panel has therefore made a series of recommendations to the Local Strategic Partnership and its members which aim to promote the further involvement of the sector in addressing local issues.

We would like to thank all those organisations and partners who took part in the review and for their candour during interview. We would particularly like to thank colleagues at the Tameside Third Sector Coalition for their help in providing information about the sector and helping to identify potential interviewees.

We hope that this report goes some way to enhancing the role of the voluntary and community sector and we look forward to reviewing progress against the recommendations in due course.'

**Details:** The 'Opening Doors for Older People' Project is opening its doors to community and voluntary groups to help provide services for older people. The aim of the 'Opening Doors for Older People' Fund is to provide groups and organisations with the opportunity to deliver new, innovative and creative projects and services for older people, through an application process which is as clear and simple as possible.

The Fund will offer grant amounts for groups specifically working with older people to

support new and expanding services and activities which directly benefit older people in areas such as;

1. Improved health and emotional well-being
2. Improved quality of life
3. Making a positive contribution
4. Exercise of choice and control
5. Freedom from discrimination and harassment
6. Economic well-being
7. Personal dignity and respect



**Who is it for?:** The Fund is open to any group or organisation for older people, whose objectives and outcomes are consistent with those of the 'Opening Doors for Older People' Project. The Fund is available for new initiatives, expansion of activities and the continuation of existing services and schemes.

Some areas of particular interest to the Project are;

- Home and garden maintenance services
- Personal transport services (volunteer based)
- Falls prevention
- Talk therapies and counselling schemes
- Healthcare, exercise schemes and healthy initiatives
- Home energy saving schemes and home & community safety initiatives
- Befriending and buddy schemes

Examples of each type and level could include:

- **Service** - The development of a new service - for example a home and garden maintenance service.
