Your Rights and Responsibilities

Dear Service User

When you enter a drug or alcohol treatment service for an addiction, it can be one of the most difficult decisions you have ever had to make.

As a service we understand that it takes incredible courage and strength to take such a step and so with this in mind we have developed this leaflet to help you become more aware of what is available for you, what you can expect and what you are entitled to when you walk in through our doors.

We want you to feel confident but more importantly, we want you to feel comfortable when you enter

Your responsibilities

- You must not behave in a threatening manner, or make racist or sexist remarks, or behave in other ways, which could offend staff, service users or the general public.
- You should not attend any appointment, or the service under the influence of any drug or drink.
- You should tell the service if you change your address or contact details.

Are you entitled to enter service?

Being seen within 20 minutes of arriving for an arranged appointment

Information about and access to the comments and complaints procedure without any fallbacks on you

Choice of a male or a female worker where appropriate (or an option to change)

Being asked for your consent before information is passed on to other agencies

A care plan, *a copy of which you can see, sign and keep* ...and regular reviews of it approx every 6 months

Regular and individual Sessions with your allocated worker
