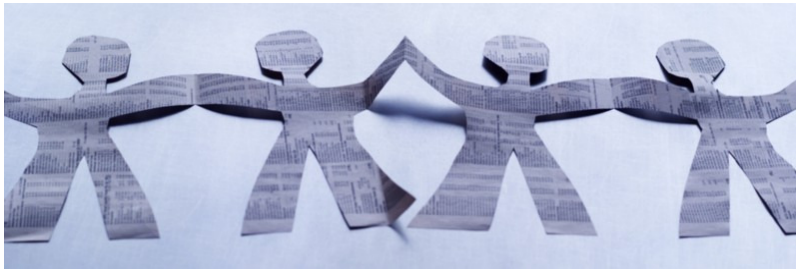


## Funding advice from T3SC

## Small Grants

## Manchester Guardian Society Charitable Trust

**Priorities/aims:** The Manchester Guardian Society supports community based organisations in Greater Manchester. They are particularly interested in helping young people, older people, provision for sick or disabled and community associations.

**How much?** Maximum of £2,000.

**Application process:** Applications only accepted by form. Only one grant within a two year period.

## Duchy of Lancaster

### Benevolent Fund

**Priorities/aims:** The Duchy of Lancaster Benevolent Fund will give funding to a wide range of community based organisations and charitable causes. They aim to support: preservation of monuments and estates, support for the elderly, infirm and disadvantaged members of society, community associations that benefit local people, young people and educational initiatives that will have beneficial results for the local community. They will not fund salary or recurrent costs.

**How much?** Grants range from £250 to £1,000

**Application process:** Forms can be obtained by writing to or calling the office.

## Awards for All

**Priorities/aims:** The small grants programme of National Lottery Funding aims to fund small projects which involve people in their community and improve their welfare. Most activities can be funded except ongoing running costs such as rent and salaries.

**How much?** Groups can have up to £10,000 over a two year period

## Community Foundation for Greater Manchester

**Priorities/aims:** The Community Foundation's primary purpose is to encourage and support grass-root community activity. This means small, community based and locally controlled groups that manage themselves, encourage active participation from volunteers, usually have minimal cash reserves and limited access to funding support. They will fund running costs, i.e. bills, volunteer costs etc. The Community Foundation for Greater Manchester manage a number of small funds. It is worth checking with them, either by phone or their website to see what funds are currently available as the list changes from time to time.

**How Much?** Generally up to £2,000 or for genuine emergencies there is a Fast Track process for grants up to £500.

**Application Process:** A simple application form can be obtained from their website or is available by post.

## Manchester Airport Community Trust Fund

**Priorities/aims:** Award grants to local groups to support community, social or environmental projects. Good for equipment or one-off items. They won't fund running costs or trips etc. Only available for parts of the Borough, see map on guidance for details.

**How Much?** Up to £5,000

## Police Property Act Fund

**Priorities/aims:** The Police Property Act Fund is made up of monies received by the police from property confiscated by order of court and then sold. The main aim of the fund is to support local projects undertaken by voluntary/charitable organisations that benefit the communities of Greater Manchester. Funding is only available for projects, and groups cannot be funded in consecutive years.



**How much?** Maximum of £1,000.

## Co-operative Foundation

**Priorities/aims:** The Co-operative Foundation is keen to support community and voluntary sector activity through grants to local groups and organisations across its trading area. It is particularly interested in locally led and run groups which can demonstrate evidence of co-operative values and principles: self-help, equality, democracy, concern for the community.

**How much:** Grants available from £500 to £30,000.

**Application process:** By application form.

**Further information:** Contact the Foundation to discuss your idea and request an application form. Foundation meets quarterly to consider applications, but there can be a two month delay from closing date to notification. ## Co-operative Membership Community Fund

**Priorities/Aims:** Will help groups that operate within the trading area of the Co-operative Group, and which aim to relieve poverty; improve education or have other purposes which could benefit the community. Applicants will also need to show how they meet the values and principles of the co-operative movement which are outlined on the application form.

**How much:** From £100 to £5,000, but a maximum of £500 for groups with no accounts or financial records.

## Tameside Older People's Partnership—opening doors for older people



**Priorities/aims:** the fund is available to any organisation for older people. It is particularly aimed at groups offering new or expanding services or activities which directly benefit older people.

**How much:** Three levels of funding are available: up to £20,000; £20,000 - £60,000 and £60,000 - £150,000.

## Health is for Life Community Grant Scheme



**Priorities/aims:** The Health is for Life Community Grants are for community/voluntary organisations, children's centres, schools or nurseries to develop new projects with a health focus. The Scheme is keen to fund innovative projects and welcomes applications that involve imaginative ways of promoting health in local communities. Projects are for new activities only.

Applicants should make it clear how their project will meet one or more of the following objectives: improve the health of local people; build stronger links between local communities and Primary Care Services or benefit people living within the boundaries of Tameside and Glossop Primary Care Trust (PCT). You can apply for part funding towards larger projects. Fund will not pay for salaries, core costs or continuation of existing projects.

**How much:** Up to £5,000.
