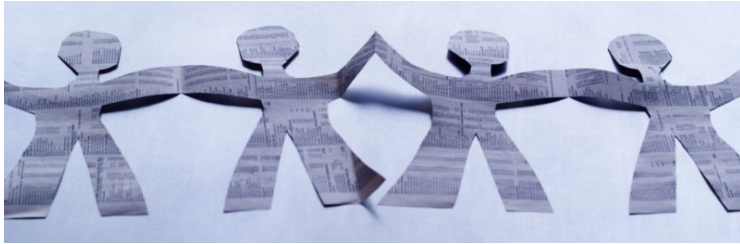


Funding advice from T3SC

Community Foundation

Priorities/aims: Small grants to encourage and support grass-root community activity. This means small, community based and locally controlled groups that manage themselves, encourage active participation from volunteers, usually have minimal cash reserves cash reserves and limited access to funding support.

How Much? Up to £2,000 or for genuine emergencies there is a Fast Track Application for grants up to £500.

Priorities: Three areas of programmes including Inclusive communities, this programme aims to alleviate poverty and exclusion amongst marginalised groups by helping to foster understanding and co-operation between people of different ethnicities, religions and backgrounds and developing economic independence and equality of disadvantaged people especially women.

How much larger grants up to £25000 over a 12 month period and small grants up to £3000.

Application process: Send an expression of interest answering various questions, if successful you will move on to stage 2

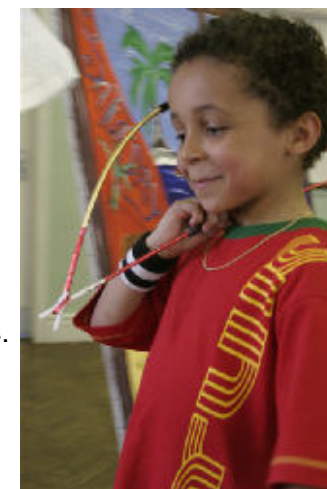
Woodward charitable trust

Priorities: Funder favours small locally based initiatives. Funding for one off projects but will consider core costs. One of the funding priorities is social and ethnic minority groups, including young people at risk of exclusion, refugees asylum seekers and travellers.

How much: Large from £10000-£50000 and small grants from £100 to £9999.

Application process: Trustees review applications twice yearly January and July.

Details: The Co-operative

Foundation is keen to support community and voluntary sector activity through grants to local groups and organisations across its trading area (includes Tameside). It is particularly interested in locally led and run groups which can demonstrate evidence of co-operative values and principles: self-help, equality, democracy, concern for the community. This programme was developed to help groups who want to make a difference in their own communities, through grass roots community activity.

Grant amount: Grants between £500 and £30,000, for one-year projects - either part or total funding. Capital and Revenue funding is available, but salaries are not being funded.

Application process: Application form available online or by post.

Closing date: 1 June 2007; 7 September 2007; and 1 December 2007.

Disadvantaged communities that suffer from economic and social deprivation. Building community links is also another grant available for refugees and asylum seekers, this fund like practical projects that help local communities work together, help towards preparing communities for the arrival of refugees and asylum seekers.

How Much? Grants of £5000 or more for small and medium sized projects.

Trusthouse Charitable Trust

Priorities/aims: The Trustees will consider applications from charities based in the UK which undertake health care, health education and community projects; and projects supporting charitable work in developing countries. The Trustees will consider applications in respect of: Physical and Mental Disability: projects involving rehabilitation, (including related arts and sport programmes); projects particularly for ex-service men and women (including former employees of the emergency services); projects for children (including holidays); and respite care; Drugs and Alcohol: rehabilitation of substance and alcohol mis-users;

How Much? The average grant given out is £5,000.

Priorities/aims: Will fund work that makes a lasting difference to peoples lives rather than simply alleviating the symptoms, projects that reduce isolation, stigma and discrimination and encourages unpopular groups to share in the life of the whole community.

How much: One off grants from £500—£15,000 and grants for more than one year from £500—£5000 for a maximum of three years.

Application process: There is a registration form that needs completing and questions that need to be answered on no more than four sides of A4 paper.
